

It was resolved to discontinue the nine o'clock services from December 1st to March 31st, and during that time to have 10:45 services the second and fourth Sunday of each month; to have Norwegian services one afternoon each month in winter, and to have one regular service in the Norwegian language each month in summer.

It was resolved to send out envelopes once a year for payment of cost of publishing the "Assistant Pastor," and if there is a shortage take the balance

out of the general fund.

It was resolved to leave to the trustees the responsibility of deciding on cancellation of services due to unfavorable weather or road conditions.
